There will be **no day of registration** available for any athletes.

Cost: \$75 per FIS race entry fee – lift tickets are not included
\$100 per NorAm race entry fee – lift tickets are not included
Refunds require a medical emergency with a letter from the physician after 1/7/25

Training: Optional training on the venue will be offered from 1:00-3:00pm on January 7.

Lift Tickets: Howelsen Hill: \$49/day ages 19 & older; \$36/day ages 18 & younger.
USSS Certified or foreign equivalent coaches receive complimentary lift tickets.
Athletes purchase tickets from the Howelsen Hill ticket office in the parking lot.

Registration Requirements:

- Competitors are required to have current US Ski & Snowboard and FIS membership in order to register for a competition. This includes required background screening and SafeSport training for any adult member (18 and older). You will not be able to register online if you do not already have an active membership for both US Ski & Snowboard and FIS.
- The minimum age for entry into the contest is 15.

- 1st place men and women - \$250/race
- 2nd place men and women - \$150/race
- 3rd place men and women - \$100/race
- 4th place men and women - \$50/race

Points: Athletes will receive FIS points.

- FIS rules will be followed and US Ski and Snowboard rules respected.
- Finals formats will be determined at the TC meeting prior to the competition.
